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2021 Discovery Surveys Target Species

The following species were selected by SDMMP for 2021 Discovery Surveys effort:

- Aphanisma (Aphanisma blitoides)**
- Orcutt's birds-beak (*Dicranostegia orcuttiana*)
- Blochman's dudleya (Dudleya blochmaniae)
- Coast wallflower (*Erysimum ammophilum*)

**Aphanisma was removed from survey effort; growing conditions in the past year were not optimal for the species (ongoing drought).



Discovery Survey Methods



Above: Survey areas (yellow outline) for Coast wallflower and survey points (red dots).

- Survey areas designated by referencing historic data, voucher collections, and species expert input.
- "Bread Crumb" method implemented to track surveyor path through suitable habitat by dropping points in Collector in real-time. Notes were included with individual points, as needed.
- If target species were found and no monitoring plot existed, sample plot was established (per IMG) and extent was mapped.
- Points were not collected if the species was already known to occur there (i.e., documented by IMG). However, if additional extent was found, it was mapped.

 - Dennery Ranch East (COOR7_3DREA007)
 - Otay Valley Regional Park (COOR7_30VRP011)
 - Tijuana River Valley Park (COOR7_1SMGU006, COOR7_1TIRI009)

Coast wallflower

- 3 Occurrences Established:
 - San Elijo Ecological Reserve (ERAM4_7SELA008): ~99
 plants
 - Torrey Pines State Natural Reserve (ERAM4_7TPSR006): ~600 plants
 - Carmel Valley/Sorrento Hills Open Space (ERAM4_6SDJA007): > ~800 plants

- Additional Extent Mapped:
- Crest Canyon (ERAM4_6DEMA001)

Blochman's dudleya

0 Occurrences established

- Additional Extent Mapped:
 - Vista del Valle, Oceanside (DUBLB_6VDLV004)
 - >14,000 additional plants (estimate)

 - Torrey Pines State Natural Reserve (ERAM4_7TPSR006)
 - Carmel Valley/Sorrento Hills Open Space (ERAM4_6SDJA007)


