#### Job Description/Summary:

Under the close supervision of the Senior Environmental Scientist Supervisor for the Non-game Wildlife Program unit in the South Coast Region (SCR), this position is responsible for coordinating the Department's research and monitoring for listed and special concern wildlife species that occur wholly or primarily within the SCR. The incumbent will also implement regional aspects of Department programs on wider ranging listed or special concern species. Duties entail planning, coordinating, and conducting local field studies, obtaining funds for projects, preparing and managing contracts, and preparing and approving Memorandum of Understandings (MOUs) associated with scientific collecting permits. Incumbent will coordinate and conduct research and monitoring on CDFW lands, provide input on management and monitoring plans for California Department of Fish & Wildlife (CDFW) lands and on properties associated with regional planning efforts. This position will coordinate with other SCR functions particularly with appropriate Habitat Conservation programs

such as Natural Community Conservation Planning (NCCP), Headquarters (HQ) personnel, as well as coordinate with other agencies on listing and recovery actions. This position serves as Regional coordinator for California least tern monitoring data.

#### **Job Description/Summary:**

The incumbent will be working under the general supervision of the South Coast Region's (SCR) Lands North Program Supervisor and under the primary lead of an Environmental Scientist or Habitat Assistant at Upper Newport Bay Ecological Reserve. The incumbent will assist in the management of Wildlife Areas and/or Ecological Reserves pursuant to the Department's proposed Land Management Plan for the area, the documented purposes for acquisition and Title 14 regulations, and to ensure the property is managed for the benefit of wildlife, plants, unique habitats and the safe use by the public.

Assists with ensuring protection and conservation of wildlife and habitats through site security, monitoring, and repair of Reserve boundaries and clean-up of Reserve interiors as required per California Department of Fish & Wildlife (CDFW) procedures and policy. Coordination with CDFW Wardens, local agencies, partners or local law enforcement including documenting incidences of encroachments and other indications of violations that threaten the integrity of the Reserves' resources and assist with restoration needs of degraded areas.

Uses and maintains specialized equipment (GPS, hand tools, power tools and equipment) in safe and good working order and assist in the maintenance of such equipment. Assists in installation, maintenance or removal of public use areas, kiosks, displays and regulatory signage or trails. Assist in identifying property management needs. Assist in administrative tasks such as; filing, organizing, photocopying, phone calls, etc. Prepare and submit monthly time sheet, vehicle logs, and activity reports for the federal grant compliance.

Assist Land Manager in protecting Department lands and ensuring public safety by posting signs, maintaining fencing, removal of refuse, maintenance of trails and roads. Assist in the maintenance of facilities. Collect and remove trash and debris, and transport to appropriate recycling or disposal facilities. Maintain equipment in safe and good working order.
